

OUR GUARANTEE

This BRISTOL STEEL FISHING ROD is guaranteed against breakage due to defective materials or workmanship, and for the space of Three Years from date hereof only. In event of claim being made on account of breakage of this rod we must have the broken parts at our factory (TRANSPORTATION CHARGES PREPAID; our guarantee does not cover expressage or postage in either direction) that we may judge of the cause of breakage ourselves. If we find that the breakage is occasioned by reason of defective material while in actual use within the time specified above, we will replace the broken part or parts free of charge.


We must have all pieces of a broken joint in order to judge as to the cause of breakage and also to enable us to furnish a new joint with the same size ferrules. A broken joint can be sent by mail for a few cents, or in case an unbroken joint is sent to have a new joint fitted to it, express paid, ounce rates, is the cheapest and safest way. It is not necessary to send the entire rod unless other repairs are desired. Be sure to write your name and address as well as ours directly on the package whenever possible, as tags are liable to be torn off.




HAT you require in a fishing rod is strength, lightness, and casting power; stiff enough to cast long distances with precision, pliant enough to make short casts a delight. IN ORDERING GOODS

Write your name distinctly, together with your full address, including the name of your street and the number thereof.

IN REMITTING BY MAIL

Do so either by express money orders, post office money orders, New York drafts or checks properly certified, making orders, checks, or drafts payable to the order of this Company.

IN ORDERING GOODS SENT BY EXPRESS C. O. D.

Enclose not less than 20 per cent of the cost of goods ordered. On C. O. D. orders we add for express charges both ways, and customers therefore will save return charges by forwarding the cost of goods with order.

IN ORDERING GOODS SENT BY MAIL

Postage should be added to remittances to the amount of 25 cents for each rod or part of rod ordered. All goods sent by mail will be at purchaser's risk.

IN ORDERING EXTRA JOINTS FOR STEEL FISHING RODS

We must know the number of the rod for which the joint or joints are wanted, stating plainly whether they wish the *first* or large joint, which fits into the handle, the *second* or middle joint, the *tip*, or small joint. Please remember that we do not term the *butt* or *grip* a joint, but the *handle*; therefore, the joint which fits into the handle *is the first joint*.

SENDING US PACKAGES

When sending us rods or parts of rods for repair or changes, always put your name and address on same, so that we may be able to identify the package and thereby avoid unnecessary delay in executing your orders.

We desire that all prospective purchasers of our rods should patronize their home dealers, but in the event that they are not kept by the dealers of your town, we shall be pleased to fill your order from the factory.

THE MASKINONGE

HAD cast at least twenty times and was reeling in, when my companion's line stiffened out, his rod bent, and the boatman jerked the skiff out into the stream just in time to prevent the fish from reaching the weeds toward which it dashed with an impetuous line-taking rush. Just how my friend held it I do not know, but he did, and in a few seconds we were well out, and he had a clear field to play the clever game; it was worth while to see him manage this fish, a furious fighter, on the slight whip-like rod. It made a deep, vicious plunge to the bottom, hunting for trouble, there was no doubt as to that, then came up with a great aqueous leap, so it seemed, reaching the surface half around the boat, though the boatman by a mighty effort kept us stern to it. Then it went into the air much as I have seen a swordfish; not a graceful leap, but one that carried it high into the air where it lashed about like a tarpon, and fell upon its side with a resounding splash. Recovering at once, it took out twenty or thirty feet of line in a straightway rush, but was slowly checked by the resilience of the rod, which forced it into the air again. Fifteen minutes slipped by and not a word was spoken, nothing heard but the occasional splash, the buzz of the little reel as it gave, or ate up the line, and the grunt of the boatman as he pulled hard on the port oar, as the fish went bounding around the boat. We knew it was a fish of large size—forty pounds at least—sixty we hoped. How boundless are the hopes and aspirations of your angler; how deeply sincere are his prognostications! Twenty minutes, thirty, and we were drifting down the main channel where a big steamer almost filled us, her passengers crowding to the rail and shouting and cheering at us. Forty minutes drifted into oblivion, and the fish began to weaken, came slowly to the quarter — where it caught a glimpse of the gaff and was away with a splendid rush. Then it came in again, was held by the rod while beneath it slipped the gaff; the next minute, quivering, snapping its ugly jaws, it received the humane quietus, when Bill held it up on the scales - a joy forever - whose weight was fifty-two and one-half pounds. It was a matter for congratulation not only to the angler, but to the boatman, who saved the day a dozen times.





DIRECTIONS FOR SETTING

Pass the line through the float from the top and through the hole in the bottom of the metal loop before attaching the hook, meantime have the cam in metal loop turned upward. Then adjust the float to suit the depth of water and turn the cam downward firmly against the line, when it will be ready for use.

In case the larger sizes of lines are used, if necessary the metal loop can readily be sprung a little more open, so as to allow the cam to turn upward easily when the float is brought in contact with tip of rod by reeling in the line.


